The Barlow is an 11-16 school situated in East Didsbury, Manchester. Established in 1985, the school is a Catholic, co-educational, voluntary aided comprehensive that is part of the Salford Diocesan family of schools.

TEACHING & LEARNING AND THE CURRICULUM

At The Barlow, we set high expectations to ensure that every pupil excels across all aspects of school. Our intention is to ensure pupils make outstanding progress through a broad, balanced and inclusive curriculum that removes any potential barriers to learning. Our pupils leave with the knowledge and skills which will not only create excellent life opportunities but will also inspire, challenge and safeguard them, and prepare them for life in modern Britain, encouraging lifelong learning, so that all pupils may ‘have life and have it to the full.’ (John 10:10). With our commitment to exceptional teaching and learning, our pupils develop the resilience, confidence, and independence to not only succeed within their academic life, but to make a positive contribution to British society and to experience future success.

Our curriculum implementation centres on a carefully planned and structured sequence of learning, which is the foundation upon which excellent progress and development are built. The curriculum is designed and implemented in such a way that it builds on prior knowledge, focuses on deeper learning of key concepts, and prepares pupils for the next stage in their education. This ensures that lessons are engaging and suitably adapted so that pupils spend the large majority

of time in lesson working independently at their level of ability. Each topic has a planned journey with clear statements setting out what pupils need to know, understand and be able to do to reach their aspirational target grade. Moving into Key Stage 4, pupils continue to have a broad curriculum offer available to them through the options process, which provides both academic and vocational opportunities for pupils’ learning.

The Barlow’s high-quality curriculum, delivered through insightful teaching and learning, promotes the achievement of progress scores above national levels and was judged as ‘Good’ by Ofsted. Furthermore, we strive to support the development of our pupils and their lives beyond the walls of the school, through a comprehensive Personal Development programme which encompasses CEIAG (Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance), PSICHE (Personal, Social, Citizenship and Health Education) and SMSC (Social, Moral, Spiritual and Cultural) themes. We pride ourselves at The Barlow at being able to provide a wide-reaching and diverse curriculum and this has led to our pupils achieving outcomes consistently above other pupils nationally.

PASTORAL CARE

At The Barlow, we are fully committed to ensuring that all our pupils receive high-quality pastoral care to support and safeguard them on their academic journey to success, whilst enabling and encouraging them to grow and flourish into confident, empathetic and kind young adults, ready to take their place in society and make a valuable contribution to the world in which they live.

Our Catholic school defines our mission and we seek to provide a place where all pupils feel a sense of belonging and are part of a ‘family’, so each pupil is assigned to a ‘Family Group’ and has a ‘Family Tutor’, who they see each day, and who is the pupil’s initial source of pastoral support in school. Positive relationships with staff underpin this support, with Ofsted in June 2024 commenting that ‘relationships between pupils and staff are courteous and respectful.’

The mental health and wellbeing of pupils is paramount and, as such, we provide an extensive support offer. This includes a comprehensive mentoring programme, led by our Pastoral Support Assistants and fully trained Mental Health First Aiders, RAINBOWS bereavement as well as a range of study support interventions. Within the Inclusion Department, we have our Hive provision, where

identified pupils are able to access additional support such as literacy and numeracy, speech, language and communication skills work and sensory intervention. Mindfulness sessions take place weekly during Family Time as an integral part of our Personal Development and PSHE curriculum.

Additionally, there is a wealth of peer support available to our pupils. Our Year 11 Prefect Team and Young Leaders ensure that our pupils are kept safe and are well catered for. Our Chaplaincy Team, Anti-bullying Ambassadors and Diversity Council work cohesively to continually promote our whole-school values of Serve, Pray, Achieve and Respect and we are extremely proud that this has been recognised on a national level via securing The BIG (Bullying Intervention Group) Award as well as the prestigious Diana Award 2019.

PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

The Barlow recognises the importance of educating the whole child and, as such, we provide a wealth of opportunities for pupils to develop both academically and personally. Our Personal Development offer is a strength of our provision and this was recognised by Ofsted in our last inspection. We strongly believe in developing pupils’ interests, talents and skills by providing them with a range of extra-curricular opportunities, particularly in the area of leadership. Pupils have the

opportunity to become leaders in prayer and liturgy, charity work, the environment, diversity, reading, digital support and sport. They can also become members of the influential Student Council.

A road map outlines the Personal Development journey that pupils will undertake during their five years at The Barlow. Character Education is integral to this, allowing pupils the opportunity to learn beyond the classroom and outside of the school itself. Personal, Social, Citizenship and

Health Education, alongside excellent teaching of Relationships Education and Careers ensures that pupils leave The Barlow ready to be active citizens within our communities. The awarding of the national Excellence in Personal Development Award in 2023 demonstrates our commitment to ensure the education our pupils receive is a holistic one.

Prospective pupils can look forward to the many opportunities on offer to them at The Barlow from after school clubs, to trips and visits abroad to Paris, Iceland and Italy; there are a plethora of opportunities as they embark upon their five-year journey of development.
